Curriculum - Discover

During this project, we will explore why we consider some things to be art, while others not. We will examine a range of modern and historical, well-known and lesser known artistic pieces from different cultures. We will produce our own pieces of art in various mediums and consider what we as humans gain from creating and viewing art.

States of Matter

- Compare and group materials together into solids, liquids and gasses.
- Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled and measure/research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C)
- Identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle

Other curriculum areas

- ART/ DT: exploring the works of various famous artists. Creating individual pieces of art and work in personal sketch books. An in depth project inspired by Lewis Caroll's 'The Jabberwocky'
- Computing online safety, animation, and photo editing.
- <u>Geography</u>: Rivers, including: The Water Cycle; rivers of the world; features of a river, erosion and depositation, How do we use rivers? Floods.
- <u>History:</u> The Romans, including: Who were the Romans? Why did the Romans invade Britain? Why did the Romans build new roads and towns? Who was Boudicca? Why was Hadiran's Wall important? What was it like inside a Roman villa?
- RE: What do Hindus believe God is like? What is the Trinity and why is it important for Christians?
- PSHE: JIGSAW: Being me in my world. Celebrating Differences

Intended Outcome

Pupils will create a folder of art work from across the school term, including pieces from across the curriculum including history, geography and computing.
